





Beautiful Georgian building

The campus is made up of three **beautiful period buildings** on five floors with amazing Georgian features and **modern teaching technology** – allowing you to enjoy learning with amazing facilities.

Premier House is an **elegant building** and has been **totally refurbished** throughout to offer the best student accommodation in London. **Centrally located and close to school**, it has 67 en-suite single rooms and a further 35 shared en-suite rooms. **Shared social and common room spaces** offer all our students a home-from-home feel. Live-in **House Parents are available 24 hours a day** onsite offering the highest standard of care and welfare. For added security the building is monitored with **CCTV cameras**.

This fabulous new accommodation is situated only **3 minutes' walk from the school** and right in the heart of the Bloomsbury area of Central London. Bloomsbury is widely recognised as a village-style **residential area**, close to the University of London core campus as well as many other academic buildings, including the world-renowned British Museum. Both **Holborn and Russell Square Underground stations are very close**.



Cultural and international evenings





Induction

During your induction we ensure that you have everything you need to **make London your second home**. We will show you the local banks, shopping areas, bus routes and bookshops so that you can **settle in easily**, as well as introducing you to clubs so that you can **make friends**.

Safely enjoy the city

London is an **exciting city** and we want all of our students to be **safe while enjoying everything that the capital has to offer**. When you arrive we will show you around London to make sure you know your way around and will ensure that you have the right balance of supervision and independence.

Supportive House Parents

We pride ourselves on growing a **community of excited and happy students**. Our team of live-in House Parents are always on hand to provide you with the **highest standards of safety and pastoral care**, including checking you are leaving for classes on time and home by your curfew. Your House Parent will also make teachers aware of issues that happen outside of the classroom such as homesickness or trouble with homework, so that you are **fully supported** at every step of your CATS journey.

Finance Officer

You can visit the Finance Officer for **assistance with any finance matters**, including paying fees, excursions and activities, and to collect your pocket money.

Personal Tutor (PT)

Every student at CATS is assigned a Personal Tutor (PT) to make sure that you are **happy and able to fulfil your potential**, and together with about 15 other students this will form your Personal Tutor Group. Your PT will **guide and assist you** in all areas of life at the school, and you will regularly meet to discuss your personal development – from personal wellbeing to aims and targets, challenges and accomplishments.

Programme Director (PD)

Each Programme of Study also has a Programme Director (PD). This is a senior teacher who oversees all the Personal Tutor Groups for your programme. If your Personal Tutor is not available for any reason you can always **talk to your Programme Director** or contact a member of the Welfare Team.

Welfare staff

Our Welfare staff will ensure that you have everything you need – offering **advice on travel, culture shock, personal emotional support and counselling for personal issues**. They are available 24 hours a day to ensure you have the support you need, so you can feel confident settling into a new home with a new culture.

Health Centre and nurse

Our fully trained onsite nurse manages the Health Centre and **provides support** including medicine and health advice, information on diet and healthy living, assessing and providing treatment if required, making referrals to doctors, dentists and other specialists.

'Tell us' button

The 'Tell us' system, accessible via the CATS London mobile app, is a student feedback system which encourages you to let us know of any problems or concerns you may have. **We promise to respond to you quickly, 24 hours a day, to sort out any issues that may have arisen**. Used by all three CATS UK schools, the system has even won an **award from the Independent Schools Association**.

Keeping parents informed

The Student Services Team, along with your Personal Tutor, act as a link between your teachers, House Parents and your parents. They will be involved in everything from **emotional and social support, to monitoring attendance, academic progress** and helping with your **university application** – your parents are then regularly updated on your progress.

International food

All meals are served on campus for catered students, cooked by our team of onsite chefs. Laundry

Wireless access

All of our residences have **internet available** either via cable connection in your room, or in most cases, via wireless.

CATS library

The school **library is available onsite** and has a growing collection of books, magazines, DVDs, careers and university information which you can borrow. There are also study tables, work stations and a digital library with personal computers and a colour photocopier/printer.

Religious worship

CATS London is a **non-denominational organisation**. We respect your right to practise your religion and are happy to give you details of the closest church, mosque, synagogue, temple or alternative place of religious worship. We can also try to put you in touch with a member of your faith who lives locally.

Evenings

Students living in our main campus residence should be back by **21.30 Sunday to Thursday**, unless you are taking part in an activity, to give you time for Prep (supervised study). On **weekends** you will be back in your residence at either **22.30 or 23.30**, depending on your age. Your evening can then be spent doing your homework and private study in your room, or socialising with your friends.

Getting around London

We encourage you to explore the varied **entertainment and educational scene** that London offers. The campus is very well connected, making it easy for you to find your way around, with both Holborn and Russell Square Underground stations nearby, as well as numerous bus stops.

Local lectures





Pre-programme

One-year programme that offers progression to A level or University Foundation. Pre-programme provides you with a **high-quality secondary education** foundation ready for you to decide on the **right study pathway** to a UK university.

Pre-programme

Pre-programme is a course **following a GCSE approach**, but for one year or less. Students can take GCSE exams in some subjects depending on the progress they make. The focus of the programme is **preparation for A level**.

Why you should study Pre-programme

The Pre-programme lets you study a **range of subjects** that give you a **good base knowledge** before you go on to study in more detail. GCSEs are the standard route to further study, and ultimately to university, in the UK. All the **top universities** recognise the programme, and they are even widely **recognised internationally** by some of the best institutions across the world.


Who Pre-programme is for

The Pre-programme is one of the ways that you can **further your study** in the UK and eventually **enter university** and study for an undergraduate degree. After you have finished Pre-programme you will normally have two years of high school left.

Number of subjects

Usually, CATS Pre-programme students will study **around seven to nine different subjects** – with Mathematics, English and Biology, Chemistry and Physics being compulsory. This will give you a good grounding in a range of subjects before you go on to **specialise and learn in more depth**.

How Pre-programme helps you to be successful

Pre-programme is widely recognised by employers across the world. High grades are a great way for you to show that you can **perform consistently** and **meet high academic standards**. You'll also learn how to study, ready to go on to A level.

How you are assessed

You will take a mixture of **internal and external examinations**. The main external exams take place in the summer term at the end of your Pre-Programme course. To ensure that you are well prepared you will also take **CATS mock exams** so that you can practise and your teachers can help with anything you are finding difficult. **English is also examined** and awarded through Cambridge exams with IGCSE First Language English or English as a Second Language (ESL) examination. Some subjects (such as the sciences) have an element of coursework, which is written or practical work completed throughout the year and counts towards your overall grade.

When the results are published

Pre-programme results are published in **June and August**. Grades range from 9 (the highest possible grade, equivalent to A*) down to grade 1 and then finally to U (the lowest grade), although a 'good pass' is considered anything from 9 to 4.

A level


A level (Advanced level) qualifications are usually obtained after **two years of studying**. The first year used to be called AS level and the second year used to be called A2, so you might recognise those names. You will expect to study A levels in **three different subjects**, although occasionally we advise students to study four subjects for specialist courses.

A levels are ideal for **focused and hard-working students** in their last two years of high school. If you excel in a particular area you will like A levels as the courses allow you to explore a **small number of subjects in a lot of depth**, providing specialised preparation towards further study.

A levels are the most common route for entry to Higher Education in the UK, so you can be sure your hard work will be **recognised by all the top universities** in the UK and around the world.

Fast-Track A level

At CATS we offer a special Fast-Track **one-year A level** option for some students. The Fast-Track programme is designed for students who can complete the normal two-year courses in less time, and is ideal if you are **highly ambitious** and in your last year of high school. The Fast-Track programme might also help you if you want to come to CATS for additional **revision to retake examinations**.



Number of subjects
