Illness and allergies

If you feel ill or have any known allergies you must inform the College Nurse as soon as possible.

You can always contact your duty House Parent for support (especially outside of College Health Centre opening hours). All students are given the College emergency telephone number.

What to do if you are ill

If you are ill, you will need to go to the College Health Centre at Elizabeth House or Varsity House

- You will be medically assessed and appropriate treatment will be given. If a Doctor's appointment is required, the College Nurse will arrange this for you. If you seek a private Doctors appointment this can also be arranged, but please note that costs will be incurred.
- Students who are too unwell to attend lessons will be on Medical Restriction and will rest in their accommodation rooms whilst receiving appropriate treatment and care.
- Hot food and drinks are available and will be provided as needed.
- Students on Medical Restriction are not expected to attend social events or go out of their accommodation without the knowledge of the College Nurse, Head of House or their Duty House Parent.
- If you do not have a temperature and are well enough to return to lessons, it is likely that you will be told to return to lessons and you must then do so.
- If you require any assistance with travelling to the College Health Centre if you are feeling unwell, please let your duty House Parent or the College Nurse know and transport arrangement will be arranged for you.
- Please note that your attendance and Visa may be affected if you do not seek medical attention from the College Nurse and fail to comply with illness procedure.
